


Idaho State Board of Education

Residency Funding

- Kootenai Health investment Jan 2011-Jun 2013:
\$3,084,241
- FY 2015 Expenses: \$3,525,000
- FY 2015 Revenues: \$3,525,000
 - Family Medicine Clinic revenues: \$2,000,000
 - Federal Revenues: IME & DME: \$850,000
 - State Appropriations Request: \$200,000
 - Kootenai Health annual investment: \$ 475,000

State Appropriations Request

- In order to provide every resident the strongest pediatric and rural training, each will spend five blocks away from Coeur d'Alene
- Time away from Coeur d'Alene will result in loss of Direct Medical Education Funds(DME) for that block of time.
