      - 5. Expedite curriculum development by reviewing existing packages for adoption in Idaho
    - ii. Fire Officers Training committee will review Fire Officer I curriculum and make recommendations for adoption of curriculum by May 1, 2003.

    - 1. Improve coordination of training through the Workforce Training Network at the technical colleges
  - e. Communication
    - i. Training Officer's Division of the Idaho Fire Chiefs to work with small volunteer fire departments to increase their awareness and involvement in training opportunities in their local areas
    - ii. EST to:
      - 1. Develop travel plan by April 11, 2003 to target areas with low occurrence of documented fire service training
      - 2. Work with the Advisory Council to target site visits
      - 3. Partner with State Fire Marshal and Bureau of Disaster Services on communication projects that benefit the Idaho fire service community
