APPLICABLE STATUTE, RULE, OR POLICY

Title 67, Chapter 35, Idaho Code

Idaho State Board of Education Governing Policies & Procedures, Section V.B.1.

BACKGROUND/ DISCUSSION

As discussed at its April 2020 meeting, due to the financial unknowns as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Business Affairs and Human Resources (BAHR) Committee felt that this item would be an important item for the full Board to discuss in order to best direct the institutions and establish expectations and to provide guidance to the institutions.

Subsequently, the Governor directed agencies to submit a Maintenance of Current Operations (MCO) budget only for FY 2022. On June 22, the Division of Financial Management (DFM) provided guidance on the freeze including the instruction that the total general fund request could not exceed the FY 2021 ongoing total general funds appropriation for each institution or agency.

The memo clarified that if an institution or agency requested line item(s), replacement capital, contract inflation, or any other increase, those increases would need to be offset elsewhere in the budget request. In addition to the items listed above, DFM is requiring the inclusion of health and variable benefit increases, and CEC, as part of the budget request, but these also need to be offset so the total FY22 budget request does not exceed the prior year total general fund appropriation.

These restrictions included the Graduate Medical Education programs. On September 17, the Administrator of the Division of Financial Management notified the Office of the State Board of Education that the Governor approved budget revision to include a line item in the amount of \$900,000 to further the GME 10-year plan.

IMPACT

The approved revision will allow programs most deeply impacted by the 5% budget reduction to continue to maintain the pipeline for graduate medical education. The revision will be included with the FY2022 budget requests and submitted to DFM and LSO for consideration by the Governor for his FY2022 Budget recommendations and by the Joint-Finance Appropriations Committee for funding.

STAFF COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Throughout challenging times, the Governor's Office and the Division of Financial Management have been aware of the concerns about the impacts of budget reductions on the GME ten-year plan.
