REFERENCE

December 2014	Board approved second reading for V.R. Policies regarding online program fees, clarifying the Technology Fee, adding Dual Credit and Summer Bridge Program fees, and revising special course fees.

APPLICABLE STATUTE, RULE, OR POLICY

Idaho State Board of Education Governing Policies and Procedures, Sections III.Y. and V.R. Idaho Code § 33-3717A

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

Board Policy V.R. defines fees, the process to change fees, and establishes the approval level required for the various student fees (Chief Executive Officer or the Board). The policy provides in part:

"The Board may consider factors such as how tuition and fees compare to tuition and fees at peer institutions, how percent increases compared to inflationary factors, how tuition and fees are represented as a percent of per

capita income and/or household income, and what share students pay of their education costs. Other criteria may be evaluated as is deemed appropriate."

Per board policy, Boise State University (BSU), Idaho State University (ISU), University of Idaho (UI), and Lewis-Clark State College (LCSC) notified students of proposed fee increases and conducted public hearings. Their respective presidents are now recommending to the Board student tuition and fee rates for FY 2024.

Attachment 1 displays information showing the decline in the percentage of the General Fund allocated to the College and Universities over the last 24 years compared to other state budgeted programs.

Attachment 2 shows the percentage of total appropriation for General Fund, Higher Education Stabilization Funds (HESF), endowment funds, and tuition and fees since 1980.

Attachment 3 compares the WICHE average tuition and fees by Carnegie classification to the Idaho institutions for fiscal years 2022-23, 2021-22, 2017-18 and 2012-13 for undergraduate/graduate and resident/nonresident students.

Attachment 4 shows a summary of FY 2024 annual requested tuition and fees.

Staff has prepared charts similar to those included in each institution's tab by aggregating the data for the 4-year institutions. The charts are described below:

Attachment 5 - Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income

The purpose of this chart is to show the increasing cost to attend college (student fees, books and supplies, room and board, personal expenses, and transportation) compared to the per capita income from 2012 to 2023. Each institution has a chart showing similar information. The "cost" of attendance reflects full tuition and fees, which differs from the actual "price" of attendance which would reflect cost net of tuition discounts through financial aid and scholarships.

The average cost to attend Idaho's 4-year institutions has grown from \$17,894 in 2012 to \$22,478 in 2022, or 25.6%, while the Idaho per capita income has increased from \$35,199 to \$53,737, or 52.7%. The increases in the cost to attend college from 2012 to 2022 are as follows:

Attachment 6: Cost to Deliver College

The purpose of this chart is to show the costs to deliver college to resident undergraduate students, changes in student enrollment, and cost per student full time equivalent (FTE.) The increases in the cost to deliver college (by major expenditure functional categories) from 2012 to 2022 are as follows:

At the same time, student FTE (horizontal red line page 14) has decreased by 10.4%. Short-term fluctuations in FTE will result in fluctuations in in the cost per FTE as the former is the denominator of the calculation. Put in constant dollars, the 10-year changes (blue line) are shown below.

Attachment 7: Resident Tuition and Fees, Consumer Price Index (CPI), Per Capita Income, and Average Annual Wage

The purpose of this chart is to show the annual percentage increase from 2010 to 2022 for resident tuition and fees, CPI, Idaho Per Capita Income, and Idaho Average Annual Wage. As the chart indicates, historically, when per capita income and annual wages have increased at a higher rate than the previous year, fees have correspondingly increased at a lesser rate. The opposite is also true, when income and wages have increased at a slower rate than the previous year, fees have correspondingly increased at a faster rate.

Attachment 8: Average CU Full-time Resident Fees as a % of Per Capita Income The purpose of this chart is to show the percentage the sticker price for Idaho resident students is to the Idaho per capita income. The rate has grown from 5.1% in 1981 to 14.5% in 2022.

Attachment 9: Percentage of CU Total Appropriation by Source

The purpose of this chart is to show the percentage of the total appropriation for the College and Universities from state General Fund, Student Fees, and Endowment funds. The impact of two consecutive years of holding tuition flat is demonstrable.

Attachment 10: Tuition/Fee Waivers and Discounts

The purpose of this report is to show the dollar value of tuition and fee waivers granted by each institution along with the Board policy section authorizing each type of waiver. The report also includes discounted fees that are used in lieu of tuition such as staff, spouse, dependent, and senior citizen fees, which are not waivers.

The chart shows the amount of discounts and waivers as a percentage of gross student fees.

The detailed fee proposals for each institution are contained in separate tabs (LCSC, UI, BSU and ISU), and each section includes the following:

- Narrative justification of the fee increase request and planned uses of the additional revenue.
- Schedule detailing the tuition and fee changes.

STAFF COMMENTS

For the past three years, the presidents of Idaho's four-year higher education institutions committed to not seek tuition increases for resident undergraduate students. Last year, each institution did request an increase to its Consolidated Mandatory Fee. This year the institutions were directed to provide as much information possible to the Board to support their FY 2024 tuition and fee requests. Board staff did not provide a general template for use in developing tuition and fee requests.

In addition to setting the FY 2024 annual undergraduate resident and nonresident tuition rates, the proposed Board action includes approval by the Board of all other tuition and fees set forth in the institutions' tuition and fees worksheets. This may include the increase of professional, self-support, and/or online program fees previously set by the Board.




Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income Idaho 4-year Institutions

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
Cost to Deliver College Idaho 4-year Institutions





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

Boise State University Fiscal Year 2024 Tuition and Fee Narrative

Tuition/Fee Request Overview

Boise State has been actively engaged in conversations regarding higher ed funding models in Idaho to address funding disparities that exist among the state institutions. Boise State receives significantly fewer dollars in base funding per student, per degree, and per EWA calculated student credit hour than the other universities. This inequity creates a tuition dependency that is compounded by the institution's size relative to its sister institutions, resulting in Boise State bearing a disproportionate share of the CEC/benefit fund shift.

The university strives to remain affordable while delivering high-quality programs and outcomes our students and other stakeholders expect. As such, the institution diligently works to balance the overall cost to students with funding priorities that are essential to student success, graduation and retention, as well as the economic and workforce needs of our region. Our cost to deliver per credit hour is the lowest in the state among four-year public institutions, demonstrating our efficient stewardship of the dollars invested in us. Our tuition rate is competitive among Idaho's universities and far lower than most in the region and country.

While Boise State has managed its growth and success over the last four years with no tuition increases, holding tuition flat is no longer an option given the current economic climate and inflation rates, the likes of which have not been seen for 40 years. According to the U.S. Labor Department, the annual inflation rate for the U.S. was 6.4% for the 12 months ended January 2023, after rising 6.5% previously. Inflation from January 2019 to January 2023 was 19%.

Boise State's tuition and fees after the proposed increase will still lag behind inflation.

Inflationary Impact

Inflation has significantly impacted salaries. Since the last tuition increase, unfunded appropriated CEC and benefit increases total over \$10 million, and these rates have not even kept pace with inflation. Moreover, in spite of these increases, we have not been able to keep up with competitors, in part because of the dramatic increase in the local cost of living. This has produced a high annualized employee turnover rate (20+%), as

employees seek better paying jobs a few blocks from campus. Consequently, the university has, by necessity, increased salaries in critical roles in order to attract and retain faculty and staff.

Procurement has also been impacted by inflation. Contract data indicates inflation of approximately 55% over the expected 19% CPI inflation for the 2019-2023 period. This is a consequence of increased hourly labor costs for services and the increased price of goods both locally, as a result of demand, and nationally. A few recent examples include:

In addition, the university spends over \$25 million a year on small dollar equipment and supplies purchased with procurement cards. Applying current inflation rates to that amount generates another \$1.6 million in anticipated cost escalations. The Library, for another example, has been impacted by annual inflationary costs in two additional areas:

- 1. Electronic journals and databases
- 2. Collection and resource management software and digital tools

Electronic resources, the vast majority of which are subscriptions to academic journals, have experienced a minimum of 5% inflation year over year. In some years, inflation has been 10-35% for specialized online resources necessary to educate students. On average, these inflationary increases create a deficit of \$162,000 annually. To manage this impact, some subscriptions have been canceled to ensure ongoing access to more critical resources, a practice that directly impacts students.

The summary of these examples, below, supports the need for a tuition increase:

Requested Increase

In order to partially mitigate inflationary pressures, Boise State is requesting an overall tuition and fee increase of 5.0%. For full-time students (11+ credit hours per semester), this equates to an annual tuition increase of \$408.96 and fee increase of \$9.04, bringing total annual in-state tuition and fees to \$8,782; part-time, in-state tuition and fees increases would increase by \$18.98 per credit hour. These increases will generate approximately \$7 million in additional revenue to partially offset unprecedented inflationary increases.

Non-resident tuition and fees will also increase by 5% to \$26,976.10 annually.

These increases will allow Boise State to attract and retain high-performing faculty and staff to ensure our students' continued success. According to the <u>U.S. News & World Report</u>, "Compared with the national average cost of in-state tuition of \$11,286, Boise State University remains competitive. For students coming from out of state, the tuition is more reasonable than the national average cost of out-of-state tuition of \$27,394." In fact, according to the College Board, in 2022/23, Idaho's average tuition and fees for full-time, in-state students at public four-year institutions is the sixth lowest in the country. With the proposed increase, Boise State's tuition will continue to remain well below the current national average and in-line with our sister institutions.

The Fee Hearing Process

Boise State's Executive Tuition and Student Fee Committee works closely with the Student Activity Fee Advisory Board (SAFAB) and ASBSU on tuition and fee recommendations. This approach is designed to give the student body an active voice throughout the process. They provide recommendations to the university president regarding the specific use of student activity fee revenues. The Advisory Board consists of ASBSU officers, students, and advisory staff.

On March 10, 2023, the Executive Tuition and Student Fee Committee held an open hearing that included presentations on the proposed rates and accepted public testimony. Following the hearing, presentations were discussed and recommendations to alter student tuition and fees were finalized and sent to President Tromp.

Professional Fees, Self-Support Programs and Online Fee Programs

The university is requesting the following increases to professional fees, self-support and online programs, which are required to cover increased costs:

- Engineering (per upper division credit hour) \$10 increase
- Executive MBA \$127.50 increase
- Bachelor of Social Work (Twin Falls) \$52.50 increase
- Bachelor of Science Nursing RN to BSN \$25 increase
- User Research (UX) Professional Undergraduate Certificate \$25 increase
- Bachelor of Applied Science & BA Interdisciplinary Professional Studies (IPS) -

\$25 increase

- Bachelor of Business Administration Management \$25 increase
- Bachelor of Arts Public Health \$25 increase
- Bachelor of Arts Integrated Strategic Communications & Certificates \$25 increase
- Online Degree Pathway \$25 increase
- Conflict Management Undergraduate Certificate \$25 increase
- Conflict Management Graduate Certificate \$65 increase
- Masters of Science in Accountancy \$205 increase
- Masters of Science in Genetic Counseling \$246 increase
- Bachelor of Science & Bachelor of Applied Science Cyber Operations & Resilience - \$25 increase
- BA Digital Innovation & Design \$25 increase
- Undergraduate Certificate Project Management \$25 increase
- Undergraduate Certificate Social Media Creator \$25 increase
- Applied Leadership Undergraduate Certificate \$25 increase
- Cryptography & Cryptanalysis Undergraduate Certificate \$25 increase

Notably, all self-support and online programs are required to cover all program costs, including CEC, approved by the legislature and increases in employee benefits costs.

Other Fees

An annual undergraduate advising fee of \$100 is proposed. Research has shown that early and ongoing career exploration and planning are essential to students making the most out of their college experience and being better prepared for a meaningful career. Clarity in career pathway is important to helping students decide on the right major for them early on. This support helps students reduce unnecessary major changes, manage the cost of their education, and increase the likelihood of graduation. This fee will support career and academic planning and allow access to consistent advising across the university.

Consolidated Mandatory Fee and Categories

The State Board of Education (SBOE) has adopted the use of a consolidated mandatory fee which is inclusive of all facilities, activity, and technology fees. SBOE policy describes these as "the fee charged for such activities as intercollegiate athletics, student health center, student union operations, the associated student body, financial aid, intramural and recreation, and other activities which directly benefit and involve students."

Per SBOE guidance, all elements of the consolidated mandatory fee then fall within one of the following four categories:

Student Enrollment, Engagement, and Success

The student enrollment, engagement and success fees provide funding to

support the multitude of activities and services available to students, both on and off campus. Included in these fees are scholarships, student employment opportunities, funding to support student success initiatives, and enrollment (recruitment and retention) activities.

No student fee increase is proposed in this category.

Institutional Operations, Services, and Support

These fees support departmental and infrastructure needs of the college and universities, including construction and maintenance of facilities and related debt service; instructional and computing resources; student involvement services and participation with athletic, arts, and cultural events.

An annual increase of \$4.44 is proposed to support the Boise State Student Union Building (SUB). These funds will be dedicated to facility repair and maintenance, salary and benefits (including funds to increase student wages), and custodial and facility services. All of these areas have been significantly impacted by inflation. The SUB and its programs have a high impact on and benefit to the student body directly. This would generate approximately \$72,000 per year.

Student Health & Wellness

The student health and wellness fee supports students' physical and mental health and well- being. Student fees support the university's health and counseling centers, the latter of which students advocated strongly to increase financial support for last academic year. Additionally, this fee supports student well-being and fitness programs and facilities, as well as recreation and intramural programs. In addition to student demand for these services, evidence demonstrates an overall improvement in the student experience when these opportunities are available. This directly impacts our student body.

An annual increase of \$4.60 is proposed to support the student recreation center. This fee would address facility needs, operations, including student, classified and professional staff salaries, wages, and benefits; outdoor activities; and club sports, areas which have all been significantly impacted by inflation. The proposed increase would generate approximately \$76,000 per year.

Student Government

This fee supports student government officers elected by students to advance their voice, initiatives, and to improve the student experience. ASBSU provides students with the opportunity to engage in discussions, events, and learning experiences that interest them and improve their learning. Students may elect to opt-out of a portion of this fee dedicated to student activities, clubs, and organizations.

No increase is proposed in this category as the units will utilize reserves to fund their initiatives.

- The University has absorbed over \$10 million in unfunded CEC/Benefit increases since FY20.





Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income Boise State University





Cost to Deliver College Boise State University





Professional Fee for Master of Science in Genetic Counseling

APPLICABLE STATUTE, RULE, OR POLICY

Idaho State Board of Education Governing Policies & Procedures, Section V.R: Establishment of Tuition and Fees

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

Boise State University is proposing a professional fee for the Master of Science in Genetic Counseling (MSGC) of \$550 per semester of Fieldwork (three total). If approved, this will allow the program to remain competitive with maintaining and establishing clinical rotation sites. Clinical experiences are a requirement of accreditation (ACGC Standards of Accreditation B3 Fieldwork Training).

The request to add a professional fee is directly related to clinical instruction (field experience) which has become highly volatile since the COVID 19 pandemic. Currently, the genetic counseling workforce is experiencing a significant shortage, mostly in the clinical roles, as professionals move towards industry leaving an absence of genetic counselors to staff clinical positions and thereby serve as supervisors for students. This has created a very competitive environment for programs. Although not common yet, some genetic counseling programs with the means have shifted to providing a small compensation for clinical supervision. A direct competitor to the Boise State MSGC program, BayPath who offer a mostly online educational model, is one of these programs compensating supervisors. In order to stay competitive, the Boise State program would use the professional fee to pay supervisors.

The program also utilizes simulated learning experiences which have been highly favorable among students and faculty. The program currently has two standardized patient encounters for each of the 12 students in the program. Ideally, the program could increase this to four standardized patient encounters in order to provide additional clinical instruction, support, and evaluation of clinical skill acquisition.

This fee proposal meets the criteria for professional fees as detailed in the above-referenced policy as follows:

Credential or Licensure Requirement:

Genetic counseling graduates must become licensed according to the state they choose to work in. Prior to applying for licensure, graduates take the American Board of Genetic Counseling (ABGC) national certification examination. Thus, to practice as a genetic counselor, graduates must be certified and licensed, much like other health care providers.

Accreditation Requirement:

The MSGC program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Genetic Counseling (ACGC).

ATTACHMENT 7

Extraordinary Program Costs:

The MSGC program operates over 21 consecutive months and many clinical instructors (supervisors) supervise students in the community and in surrounding states throughout the entire year. Current tuition is not sufficient to cover the cost of compensating clinical instruction and supervision or adding more standardized patient encounters. Clinical instruction also requires costly annual licensing of database software technology to manage each student's clinical experience, evaluation, and proficiency in skill attainment. Annual fees for accreditation and program review continue to increase from year to year. Tuition is not sufficient to keep pace with all of the required fees to operate a credentialed health care program.

Additionally, the program must cover the expenses accrued for hiring of standardized patients to replicate real patient evaluation. Due to the nature of the discipline only standardized patients with the most experience (Tier 3) can participate in the student encounters which is a higher cost to the program (\$18/hour v \$14/hour).

IMPACT

Boise State would like to implement a \$550 per semester professional fee, to be assessed during each of the three semesters in the second year of the MSGC program. The total amount of professional fees will be \$1,650. The program seeks to align with the University's goal of providing students an accessible, cost effective and high-quality graduate professional health care program.

Professional fees will be used to support student success and enhance the quality of our students' education by providing greater incentives for more clinical sites to consider partnering with the MSGC program as well as increasing the availability of standardized patient encounters. Without this change the program is unable to expand beyond the current cohort size as clinical sites are the limiting factor.

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Idaho State University FY2024 Student Tuition and Fee Request

Proposed Changes to Student Tuition and Fees

Notice of public hearings seeking testimony on proposed tuition and fee increases for the 2023-2024 academic year was sent to the Associated Students of Idaho State University on March 1, 2023, and published in the ROAR Weekly on March 1, 2023. The published rates stated that the University was considering increases that totaled an 8% increase in full-time undergraduate resident tuition and fees. Public hearings were held on March 8 and 9. Members of ISU's Administrative and Leadership Councils were present to hear feedback and respond to questions.

The attached worksheet presents the requested tuition and fee rate changes for FY2024.

At the close of all the University processes, the University decided to forward to the Board a tuition and fee increase request of 5% for full-time undergraduate resident students.

Background

The FY2024 College and Universities budget approved by the Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee does not include general fund support for ISU's \$2.4 million inflationary adjustments (with utility increases of \$1.2 million alone), \$1.4 million to complete a fully funded change in employee compensation or \$1.1 million in capital asset replacement and occupancy costs. The Capacity Enhancement Funding, less the Enrollment Workload Adjustment, nets \$773,000 in additional general fund support. This is the only true increase in funding provided by the FY2024 appropriation.

The reality of the appropriation is that it results in a budget gap of \$4.1 million relative to the FY2023 budget. To address this gap, the University would need to raise tuition and fees by 8% to remain budget neutral. If the gap is not addressed, the existing structural deficit in the University's central budget will be exacerbated.

Even with these budget challenges, the University is in an overall healthy financial position. Prudent management of the University's finances, conservative budgeting, and mindful spending has resulted in an increase in net position over the last four years. However, the University is still in a multi-year process of managing a structural budget

deficit in the central appropriated budget. The requested 5% increase will not provide sufficient resources to address the shortfalls in the legislatively approved budget.

One key factor to consider is that the University's efforts to increase enrollment after a decade of declines are working. ISU has seen a positive enrollment increase for four semesters, which also positively impacts revenue. The University needs to be mindful of the impact raising tuition will have on our students. Access and affordability are key issues for Idaho students, and raising tuition will have a direct impact on both. Given these issues, the University has not raised tuition in three years, with last year being only a 1.1% increase in student activity fees. Raising tuition by 5% this year is the equivalent of having raised tuition 1.5% per year for the last four years, which is still not enough to keep pace with inflation and wage increases over that same time period.

To address its structural deficit, the University has launched a Budget Optimization Initiative, a year-long comprehensive, collaborative, and transparent study of the entire budget to present recommendations for budget rightsizing.

Given all the above factors, a tuition increase of well over 5% is warranted. The proposed tuition and fees submitted herewith for your approval, in conjunction with a year-long budget optimization initiative, will help resolve ISU's budget deficit and provide fiscal sustainability and resources for mission fulfillment.


Summary of Proposed Tuition and Fees

Resident Undergraduate Tuition & Fees

Resident undergraduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$4,178 per semester (\$8,356 per year), a \$199.20 (\$398.40 per year) or 5% increase over FY2023 rates. Part-time resident undergraduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$426.75 per credit hour, a \$20.31 or 5.0% increase over FY2023 rates.

These increases will support CEC, fringe rate increases, other inflationary factors, and continued investments in student retention and success.

The chart on the following page shows ISU's resident undergraduate tuition and fees indexed to the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI). Proposed rates for FY2024 are equivalent to a 1.5% annual increase over the four- year period from FY2021 to FY2024 and are still not on pace with inflation.

Resident Graduate Tuition & Fees

Full-time resident graduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$5,634 per semester (\$11,268 per year), a \$318.88 (\$637.76 per year) or 6% increase over FY2023 rates. Part-time resident graduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$564 per credit hour, a \$23.52 or 4.4% increase over FY2023 rates. These proposed rates align part-time resident graduate tuition at 1/10 full-time tuition.

These recommended fee increases consider market factors and costs required for delivering high quality graduate educational programs, to include anticipated CEC and fringe rate increases, inflationary factors, and program investments.

Non-Resident Tuition & Fees

Full-time non-resident undergraduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$13,733 per semester (\$27,466 per year), a \$765.39 (\$1,530.78 per year) or 5.9% increase over FY2023 rates. Part-time non-resident undergraduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$858 per credit hour, a \$155.54 or 22.1% increase over FY2023 rates. These proposed rates align part-time non-resident undergraduate tuition at 1/16 full-time tuition.

Full-time non-resident graduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$15,076 per semester (\$30,152 per year), a \$772.07 (\$1,544.14 per year) or 5.4% increase over FY2023 rates.

Part-time non-resident graduate tuition and fees are proposed at \$942 per credit hour, a \$105.50 or 12.6% increase over FY2023 rates. These proposed rates align part-time non-resident graduate tuition at 1/16 full-time tuition.

These recommended fee increases consider market factors and costs required for delivering high quality educational programs and services, to include anticipated CEC and fringe rate increases, inflationary factors, and program investments.

Consolidated Mandatory Fee

Consolidated Mandatory Fees are included in the rates presented above. They are proposed at \$1,181.88 per semester (\$2,363.76 per year), a \$167.10 (\$334.20 per year) or 16.5% increase over FY2023 rates. Part-time rates are proposed at \$83.13 per credit hour, a \$11.72 or 16.4% increase over FY2023 rates. These increases support CEC, fringe rate increases, and other inflationary costs for services and activities housed in local and auxiliary funds. They also include increases in the Facilities and Information Technology fees to support extraordinary inflationary cost increases and multi-year phase-out of the per-credit fee for online courses. Proposed Mandatory Student Activity fees include an opt-out Student Clubs and Organizations Fee of \$4.50/semester for full-time students and \$.35/credit hour for part-time students.

Professional Fees

ISU is proposing increases to select professional fees as outlined below. These recommendations are based on an analysis of program costs, student impact, workforce outcomes, and market conditions.

Athletic Training

The College of Health is proposing a professional fee increase of 4.5% (\$34 per semester, \$68 per year) for the Master of Science in Athletic Training. This increase will help offset costs associated with administrative support functions, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Audiology

The Audiology program in the Department of Communication Sciences Disorders (CSD) is proposing a professional fee increase of 28.2% (\$31 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, equipment upgrade and replacement, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Communication Sciences and Disorders

The Bachelor of Science in Communication Sciences and Disorders program is proposing a new professional fee of \$180 per credit hour. This new fee realigns fees for the Speech Language Pathology on-campus, online, and pre professional programs with the Communication Sciences and Disorders program, while keeping program costs in line with peer institutions and covering program expenses.

Dental Hygiene Bachelor of Science Program

The Dental Hygiene Department is proposing a professional fee increase of 7.5% (\$350 per session, \$700 per year) for its Dental Hygiene Bachelor of Science Program. This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, dental supplies and personal protective equipment, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

<u>Dental Hygiene Master of Science Program</u>

The Dental Hygiene Department is proposing a professional fee increase of 8.6% (\$16 per credit hour) for its Master of Science in Dental Hygiene Didactic Program and 2.2% (\$6 per credit hour) for its Master of Science in Dental Hygiene Thesis program. These increases will help offset costs associated with administrative support functions, computer and technology upgrades, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Dietetics

The Master of Science in Nutrition with Dietetic Internship Program within the department of Nutrition and Dietetics is proposing a professional fee increase of 4.5% (\$49 per session, \$147 per three-session year). This increase will help offset costs associated with materials and supplies, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Graduate Counseling

The Department of Counseling is proposing a professional fee increase of 14% (\$99 per session, \$198 per year) for the Master's in Counseling program. This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Idaho Dental Education Program (IDEP)

IDEP provides access to dental education for Idaho students through a cooperative agreement between ISU and Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. The program fee is set by Creighton University.

Medical Laboratory Science

The Medical Lab Science program is proposing a professional fee increase of 7% (\$55 per session, \$110 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with administrative support functions, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Nursing BSN / RN to BS Completion / BS Accelerated

The BSN, RN to BS Completion, and the BS Accelerated programs in the School of Nursing are proposing a professional fee increase of 6.5% (\$76 per session, \$152 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Nursing DNP

The Nursing DNP program in the School of Nursing is proposing a professional fee increase of 5.8% (\$142 per session, \$248 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Nursing MSN

The Nursing MSN program in the School of Nursing is proposing a professional fee increase of 8.3% (\$117 per session, \$234 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Nursing PhD

The Nursing PhD program in the School of Nursing is proposing a professional fee increase of 6.8% (\$128 per session, \$256 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Occupational Therapy

The Occupational Therapy (OT) Program is proposing a professional fee increase of 7% (\$249 per session, \$747 per three-session year) for non-resident students and 7% (\$113 per session, \$339 per three-session year). These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Pharmacy

The College of Pharmacy is proposing a professional fee increase of 9% (\$766 per session, \$1,532 per year) for non-resident students and 9% (\$559 per session, \$1,118 per year) for resident students. These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, faculty promotion, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Physical Therapy

The Physical Therapy (PT) Program is proposing a professional fee increase of 9.4% (\$361 per session, \$1,083 per three-session year) for non-resident students and 9.3% (\$164 per session, \$492 per three-session year) for resident students. These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, faculty salaries, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Physician Assistant

The department of Physician Assistant Studies is proposing an 7.6% (\$626 per session, \$1,878 per three-session year) increase in professional fees for non-resident students and a 7.6% (\$612 per session, \$1,836 per three-session year) increase for resident students. These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, faculty promotion, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Radiographic Science

The Radiographic Science Program is proposing a professional fee increase of 7.2% (\$33 per session, \$66 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with equipment upgrades and replacements, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Sign Language Interpreting

The Sign Language Interpreting program is proposing a professional fee increase of 7.5% (\$9 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with faculty salaries, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Social Work BA

The Social Work BA program is proposing a professional fee increase of 40% (\$50 per session, \$100 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with increased instruction and accrediting fees. Additionally, this increase will help offset costs associated with the student field experience and outcomes system.

Social Work MS

The Social Work MS program is proposing a professional fee increase of 24.3% (\$50 per session, \$100 per year). This increase will help offset costs associated with increased instruction and accrediting fees. Additionally, this increase will help offset costs associated with the student field experience and outcomes system.

Speech-Language Pathology (On-Campus)

The Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) On-Campus program in the Department of Communication Sciences Disorders is proposing a professional fee increase of 94.7% (\$90 per credit hour). This large increase realigns fees for the SLP on-campus, online, pre professional programs and the new Communication Sciences and Disorders BS program, while keeping program costs in line with peer institutions. This increase will help offset costs associated with equipment replacement, CEC, fringe rate increases, medical malpractice insurance, and other inflationary factors.

Speech-Language Pathology (Online)

The Speech-Language Pathology (Online) program in the Department of Communication Sciences Disorders (CSD) is proposing a professional fee decrease of 23.8% (\$125 per credit hour). This decrease realigns fees for the SLP on-campus, online, pre professional programs and the new Communication Sciences and Disorders BS program, while keeping program costs in line with peer institutions and covering program costs.

Speech Language Pathology Online Pre-Professional

The Speech-Language Pathology Online Pre-Professional program in the Department of Communication Sciences Disorders (CSD) is proposing a professional fee decrease of 43.6% (\$139 per credit hour). This decrease realigns fees for the SLP oncampus, online, pre professional programs and the new Communication Sciences and Disorders BS program, while keeping program costs in line with peer institutions and covering program costs.

Online and Self-Support Program Fees

ISU is proposing increases to select online and self-support program fees as outlined below. These recommendations are based on an analysis of program costs, student impact, workforce outcomes, and market conditions.

Clinical Psychopharmacology

The Clinical Psychopharmacology program in the College of Pharmacy is proposing an online program fee increase of 3.4% (\$19 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, and other inflationary factors.

Elementary Education BA/BS

The Elementary Education BA/BS programs in the College of Education are proposing an online program fee increase of 8% (\$21 per credit hour). These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, program expansion, and other inflationary factors.

Fire Services Administration

The Fire Services Administration program in the Department of Emergency Services is proposing an online program fee increase of 6% (\$15 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, program expansion, and other inflationary factors.

Health Informatics

The Health Informatics program is proposing an online program fee increase of 5.4% (\$29 per credit hour) for the Master of Science in Health Informatics program. This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, and other inflationary factors.

Land Surveying

The Land Surveying Certificate Program in the College of Technology is proposing an online program fee increase of 9.1% (\$30 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, field support, and other inflationary factors.

Special Education BA/BS

The Special Education BA/BS programs in the College of Education are proposing an online program fee increase of 8% (\$21 per credit hour). These increases will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, program expansion, and other inflationary factors.

Surveying Technician Technical Certificate

The Surveying Technician Technical Certificate Program in the College of Technology is proposing an online program fee increase of 9.1% (\$30 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, capital equipment, and other inflationary factors.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography

The Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program within the Department of Radiographic Sciences is proposing a self-supporting program fee increase of 7.3% (\$22 per credit hour). This increase will help offset costs associated with CEC, fringe rate increases, program equipment, and other inflationary factors.

Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income Idaho State University




Cost to Deliver College Idaho State University





Lewis-Clark State College Tuition & Fees Proposal

Proposed Changes to Student Fees

Lewis-Clark State College requests State Board approval to increase tuition and fees by 5.6% for FY24 to meet institutional needs. The revenue generated will provide support for increases in the ongoing costs of the institution, including the change in employee compensation and health insurance costs, and increases in contractual obligations such as technology.

The specific components of the proposed tuition and fee increases are as follows:

Resident Full-Time Tuition & Fees

 A 5.6% increase in full-time tuition/fees which includes an annual \$352 (6.0%) in tuition, and \$40 (2.6%) in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$392 per year. The proposed FY24 full-time tuition and fees is \$7,388 per year versus the prior year fee of \$6,996.

Part-Time Tuition & Fees

- A 5.6% increase in the part-time (per credit hour) fee which includes \$18 (5.8%) in tuition and \$2 (4.1%) in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$20 per credit hour. The proposed FY24 part-time fee is \$378 versus the prior year fee of \$358.
- A 5.6% increase in the summer (per credit hour) fee or \$19 (8.2%) in tuition and \$1 (0.8%) in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$20 per credit hour. The proposed FY24 summer fee is \$378 versus the prior year fee of \$358.

Summer Full-Time Tuition & Fees

• A 5.6% increase in the full-time tuition/fees which includes \$176 (6.0%) in tuition and \$20 (2.6%) in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$196. The proposed FY24 summer full-time tuition and fees is \$3,694 versus the prior year fee of \$3,498.

Fees Detail

The State Board of Education has recently adopted the use of a consolidated mandatory fee which is inclusive of all facilities, activity, and technology fees. Per State Board guidance, all elements of the consolidated mandatory fee then fall within one of the following four subcategories:

- Student Enrollment, Engagement, and Success
- Institutional Operations, Services, and Support
- Student Health & Wellness
- Student Government A subset of this fee includes funding for student activities, clubs, and organizations; of which students shall be allowed to opt-out of payment of this subset of the fee. For LC State, the opt-out amount is \$3 per semester.

BUSINESS AFFAIRS – SECTION II TAB X, Page BUSINESS AFFAIRS AND HUMAN RESOURCES APRIL 25-26, 2023 Technology Fee

The technology fee funds computer labs, a pay for print system, and the campus enterprise resource planning system. The requested \$11 per semester (\$22 per year) increase for full-time students and \$1.00 per credit hour for part-time students will provide the revenue necessary for the rising cost of technology and software maintenance contracts.

Non-Resident Tuition & Fees

- A 5.6% annual increase in non-resident tuition and fees per year. The proposed FY24 non-resident tuition and fees is \$21,386 per year versus the prior year of \$20,252.
- A 5.6% annual increase in Asotin County non-resident tuition and fees per year. The proposed FY24 Asotin County non-resident tuition and fees is \$11,686 per year versus the prior year \$11,066.

Graduate Resident Full-Time Tuition & Fees

□ A 5.6% increase in full-time tuition/fees which includes an annual \$362 (5.9%), \$124 (5.9%) in graduate fees, and \$40 in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$526 per year. The proposed FY24 full-time tuition and fees is \$9,932 per year versus the prior year fee of \$9,406.

Graduate Non-Resident Full-Time Tuition & Fees

□ A 5.6% increase in non-resident full-time tuition/fees which includes an annual \$1,138 (5.7%), \$124 (5.9%) in graduate fees, and \$40 in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$1,302 per year. The proposed FY24 full-time tuition and fees is \$24,560 per year versus the prior year fee of \$23,258.

Graduate Part-Time Tuition & Fees

□ A 5.5% increase in the part-time (per credit hour) fee which includes \$24 (5.7%) in tuition and \$2 (4.1%) in consolidated mandatory fees for a total increase of \$26 per credit hour. The proposed FY24 part-time fee is \$496 versus the prior year fee of \$470.

Idaho Correctional Education Per Credit Hour Fee

The college is requesting a new \$310 per credit hour fee to be effective with SU 2023. This new fee is intended to help incarcerated populations of students who have completed a GED or high school diploma to gain college credits. A lower per credit hour fee than the traditional part-time rate is proposed due to limited funding availability for these populations and the limited services that LC State would provide such as no campus activities or services.

Idaho Correctional Education Full-Time Tuition

The college is requesting a new \$3,439 full-time tuition to be effective with SU 2023. This new tuition is intended to help incarcerated populations of students who have completed a GED or high school diploma to gain college credits. A lower full-time tuition rate than

the traditional full-time rate is proposed due to limited funding availability for these populations and the limited services that LC State would provide such as no campus activities or services.





Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income Lewis-Clark State College





Cost to Deliver College Lewis-Clark State College





University of Idaho Tuition and Fee Narrative

The Fee Process

The University of Idaho collaborative fee process kicked off last fall with the call for proposed changes to dedicated student activity fees. At the same time, university leadership focused on identifying funding needs and potential sources, including state and tuition funds. This included discussions between executive and student leadership about the financial prospects for the coming year and how student activity fees fit into the overall financial picture. Throughout the fall and early spring, this work continued, with active participation by the Dedicated Student Activity Fee Committee (DSAFC). This DSAFC representative committee includes student leaders from the Associated Students of the University of Idaho (ASUI), the Graduate and Professional Students Association (GSPA), and the Student Bar Association (SBA) representing the law school. All units currently receiving dedicated fees or requesting a new dedicated fee submitted data to the DSAFC. A public meeting of the DSAFC was held on January 26, 2023, with each unit requesting an increased or new fee presenting their request.

The DSAFC committee met several times in February to discuss the fee requests from each unit. A comprehensive activity fee proposal was developed by student leaders and presented to executive leadership on February 27th. This fee proposal was incorporated into the overall proposed tuition and fee package and published for public review via the formal University Notice of Intent to Adopt Student Tuition and Fee Changes, which was issued on March 14th as required by Board policy. The period of public comment is open through April 24th and will include a public presentation and open forum on proposed student fees on March 30th. During this period, students and interested citizens may provide comments, in writing, regarding the proposed fee increases. Written comments will be forwarded to the Regents, and a recording of the March 30th open forum will be available.

Tuition and Fee Request Overview

The FY 2024 proposal for tuition and fee changes reflects the University of Idaho's ongoing commitment to maintain accessibility, while at the same time addressing the rising costs of providing high quality education and experiences to our students. The university is requesting tuition increases of \$360 per year and \$520 per year for undergraduate and graduate students respectively. These increases will generate approximately \$2.7M to fund the non-state funded portion of the \$1.20 per hour CEC for General Education positions and a portion of the impact of inflation. The FY 2024 proposal also includes a \$60 per year increase for full-time mandatory fees which funds the \$1.20 per hour CEC for fee-funded positions as well as several programmatic fee increases as proposed by the Dedicated Student Activity Fee Committee. Overall, the tuition and fee increase for full-time resident undergraduate students is \$420 per year or 5.0%. Full-time non-resident undergraduate students will see the same increase of \$420 per year which is a 1.5% increase. For full-time graduate students, the proposed increase is \$580 per year, or 5.8% for residents and 2.0% for non-residents.

The specific components of the tuition and fee request are as follows:

Undergraduate Resident and Non-Resident Tuition

The University of Idaho is requesting a \$360 per year increase to the undergraduate resident tuition of \$6,180, and the undergraduate non-resident tuition of \$25,416 per full-time student per year, bringing the proposed tuition rates to \$6,540 per year for residents and \$25,776 per year for non-residents. When combined with proposed fees, this results in a total tuition and fee package of \$8,816 per year for undergraduate resident and \$28,052 per year for undergraduate non-resident students.

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Tuition and Fees – New Students (FY 2023 & FY 2024)

FY 2024 represents the second year of a four-year phased implementation of the WICHE WUE rate calculation methodology. Prior to FY 2023, the university had set the WUE rate equal to 150% of the full-time undergraduate resident combined tuition and fee rate. Per WICHE, the correct calculation is 100% of the full-time resident combined tuition and fee rate plus 50% of only the full-time resident tuition rate. To shift to the correct methodology, the university has the approval of WICHE to implement the WICHE methodology for new students starting FY 2023, while continuing the old methodology for students enrolled prior to FY 2023. Based on this, the University of Idaho is requesting an increase of \$600 per year to the WUE tuition and fee package for WUE students enrolled starting in FY 2023 or FY2024, taking it from \$11,486 to \$12,086. This is based on the WICHE calculation of the full-time resident combined tuition and fee rate of \$8,816 plus 50% of the full-time resident tuition only of \$6,540 or \$3,270.

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Tuition and Fees – Ongoing (Prior to FY 2023)

As indicated above, the university will continue using 150% of the full-time undergraduate tuition and fee rate for WUE students who enrolled prior to FY 2023. Based on this, the University of Idaho is requesting an increase of \$630 per full-time student per year to the WUE tuition and fee package total for ongoing WUE students. This will increase the WUE total tuition and fees from \$12,594 to \$13,224 and is based on the requested full-time resident tuition and fee total of \$8,816 multiplied by 150%.

Graduate Resident and Non-Resident Tuition

The University of Idaho is requesting a \$520 per year increase to the graduate resident tuition of \$7,752 and the graduate non-resident tuition of \$26,988 per full-time student per year, bringing the proposed tuition rates to \$8,272 per year for residents and \$27,508 per year for non-residents. When combined with proposed fees, this results in a total tuition and fee package of \$10,548 per year for graduate resident and \$29,784 per year for graduate non-resident students.

Consolidated Mandatory Fee Details

Increases to elements of the consolidated mandatory fee are as follows and will generate an estimated \$920K per year:

\$ 0.94 Student Enrollment, Engagement and Success

42.72 Institutional Operations, Services and Support

13.40 Student Health and Wellness

2.74 Student Government

0.20 Student Government – Opt Out Portion

\$60.00 Total Consolidated Mandatory Fee Increase

These mandatory fee changes include a \$9.60 per year increase to the student computing fee to support increases in student temporary help, wireless network funding, and student communications and training. Additionally, it includes a \$43.08 per year increase in student activity fees aimed at funding the \$1.20 per hour CEC for fee-funded positions and \$9.32 in increases for programmatic funding support. Finally, this proposal includes a decrease of \$2.00 per year to the facility fee, bringing the total consolidated mandatory fee increase to an even \$60.00 per year or \$2,276.00.

Part-Time Tuition and Fees

The University of Idaho is requesting a tuition increase of \$21 per student credit hour for undergraduate and a \$32 per student credit hour for graduate students. This, coupled with no change in the proposed part-time fee rates results in total part-time tuition and fee rates of \$441 and \$586 per student credit hour for resident undergraduate and graduate students respectively and \$1,403 and \$1,655 per student credit hour for nonresident undergraduate and graduate students respectively.

New Student Orientation

The University of Idaho is proposing an increase from \$100 to \$125 per student to address the increased expenses associated with staffing and providing food at the event.

Professional, Self-Support and Online Program Fees

The University of Idaho is requesting the following changes to professional, self-support fees and online program fees:

Professional Fees:

- Law Professional Full-Time Fee: Increase to \$15,384 per year; an increase of \$1,000 or 7.0%
- Law Professional Part-Time Fee: Increase to \$855 per credit hour; an increase of \$56 or 7.0%
- Art & Architecture Full-Time Fee: No change, remains at \$1,432 per year
- Art & Architecture Part-Time Fee Undergraduate: No change, remains at \$72 per credit hour
- Art & Architecture Part-Time Fee Graduate: No change, remains at \$80 per credit hour

Self-Support Program Fees:

- MOSS Environmental Ed Graduate Program: Increase to \$20,536 for the 2-semester program; an increase of \$1,344 or 7.0%
- MOSS MNR Environmental Ed/Science Communications: Increase to \$25,976 for the 2-semester + summer program; an increase of \$1,700 or 7.0%
- Master of Science in Athletic Training: Increase to \$23,571 for the 1 year/3 semester program; an increase of \$576 or 2.5%
- Doctorate in Athletic Training: Increase to \$21,462 for the 1 year/3 semester program; an increase of \$524 or 2.5%

Online Program Fees:


- Master of Public Administration: No change, remains at \$3,750 per semester
- Bachelor of Business Administration: New fee of \$360 per credit hour

The online Bachelor of Business Administration program was approved by the State Board of Education at the June 15, 2022, meeting; however, while the fee was referenced in the materials, it was not included in the motion so was not officially approved. We are now requesting approval for a fee of \$360 per credit hour in anticipation of the program starting in Summer 2023.




Cost of Attending College vs. Per Capita Income University of Idaho



Cost to Deliver College University of Idaho





Re: Law Student Dedicated Professional Fee Request for FY 2024

The College of Law requests an increase in the Law School Dedicated Professional fee of \$1,000 per year for Fiscal Year 2024. This dollar amount represents almost increase of 7% over the current level of \$14,384 per year to \$15,384 per year.

This proposed fee is necessary to maintain the high quality of education we provide to students. This fee is not, nor should it be perceived as, a substitute for other funding from the University or from any other source. We fear that that perception could lead to the ultimate functional privatization of the College of Law, which would be detrimental to legal education in the State of Idaho. Out of necessity, the fee has been used by the College of Law to preserve the quality of legal education despite recent years of financial challenges.

The requested fee increase serves two general purposes: it allows us to continue to achieve our statewide, land grant mission as Idaho's public law school, and it supports specific areas of strategic investment identified by our faculty as well as the accreditation visit by the American Bar Association. This fee increase is driven in large part by our need to hire and replace a significant number of faculty and staff in an employment market that is very competitive (especially in Boise, which is currently among the least affordable cities in the United States). Moreover, because the College pays a number of faculty and staff using the professional fee fund, we must also ensure that we have sufficient funds available to meet any requirements that the legislature and/or the University impose with respect to CEC for those fee-funded employees.

These proposed uses for the fee increase have long been supported by the law student leadership. It is important to the students that the College of Law remain competitively priced while still taking reasonable steps to ensure that needed programming and other fiscal requirements are met. The fee increase reflects this balancing of interests, though the College's overall funding needs are greater than can be supported by fee increases alone.

RE: Athletic Training Programs Fees

Dear Members of the Board.

In 2011, The Doctor of Athletic Training (DAT) and Master of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) programs were approved by the State Board of Education. The first DAT class was admitted in June 2011 and the first MSAT class followed in 2013.

The purpose of this memo is to renew an annual request for a 2.5% increase in the self-support program fee for the MSAT and DAT Programs. In the last seven (7) years, the Athletic Training Programs have requested a fee increase twice (2016 and 2022). With these marginal increases, both programs at the University of Idaho remain competitively priced when compared to other programs. However, these requests for increases have come about due to a few primary factors:

- 1. Annual fees associated with professional and program needs (e.g., textbooks and technology) alongside programmatic offerings (i.e., hosted continuing education courses) continue their increase in cost. This is anticipated year to year but has been worsened due to market inflation.
- 2. Costs related to overall program delivery have also increased which has outpaced the approximate cumulative increase in fees of approximately 5% since 2016.
- 3. External accreditation for the MSAT program requires specific skills to be taught annually. The MSAT program anticipates the need to purchase capital equipment and faculty training in the next year to remain in compliance.

Our programs have retained their national recognition as a result of their innovative approach to education and student preparation as well as the institutional support provided by the University and its stakeholders. These requested increases are vital to ensuring further success and viability. The proposed outline for fee increases is listed in the table below.

These requested increases are critical to ensuring the success and viability of our programs in the coming years. An outline of the current and proposed self-support fee increases is outlined in the table below,

In 2017, the State Board of Education approved a self-support program fee request from the College of Natural Resources (CNR) to support the operation of a successful Master of Natural Resources (MNR) program at the McCall Field Campus, home of the award-winning McCall Outdoor Science School (MOSS). The program culminates in a MNR with special emphasis on Environmental Education and Science Communication.

The purpose of this memo is to request a 7% increase in the self-support program fee for the school year 2023 – 2024 from the current rate of \$12,138 per semester, to \$12,988 per semester. This increase will keep pace with inflationary costs illustrated by the current CPI of 7%. Specifically, this requested increase:

- 1) Will defray the increased cost of faculty teaching the program and staff providing administrative support resulting from state approved CEC increases; costs of technology and scientific equipment needed for teaching, travel, and field study;
- 2) Will proportionately cover increased costs of operating and maintaining the 14-acre McCall Field Campus and the buildings contained therein generally attributed to normal inflation and in keeping with a comprehensive new Campus Master Plan completed in 2014. Please note that the requested fee increase will only support facility costs appropriate to the graduate program and that other facility costs will be covered using other appropriate budget lines;
- 3) Will not affect any students currently enrolled in the program. This requested increase would take effect for the new cohort of graduate students entering in Fall 2023.

Talented students come to our program in McCall from within the state as well as from across the U.S. and Canada, with many students having graduated from highly selective undergraduate institutions. Students apply their graduate coursework through hands-on teaching and outreach to form a unique link between university level STEM education and the Idaho K12 education system. RE: University of Idaho Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) - Online Program Fee

Dear Members of the Board,

At its June 15, 2022 meeting, the Idaho State Board of Education approved the University of Idaho's proposal to create a Bachelor of Business Administration which will be delivered via a 100% distance modality. This fully online program will begin to admit students in the summer of 2023.

The purpose of this memo is to request an institutional online program fee consistent with Board Policy V.R.3.b.ii at \$360 per credit hour in lieu of resident or non-resident tuition and mandatory fees. This program meets the requirements of this board policy as (1) the program consists of a "grouping of courses that provide the student with the knowledge required for a baccalaureate" degree and (2) all courses will be offered and delivered via a distance learning modality.

The online Bachelor of Business Administration is designed with affordability in mind. Credit hours will be priced lower than the current part-time tuition rate for a Bachelor of Science in Business student (currently: Idaho resident - \$420.00 per credit hour, non-Idaho resident - \$1,382 per credit hour). Additionally, the rate of \$360.00 per credit hour ensures competitiveness with other online undergraduate business programs in the state of Idaho and region and is an attractive price point for non-Idaho residents. All courses will be offered in a 100% online asynchronous format to maximize the flexibility necessary for the demographic target of the program (non-traditional and working students). Classes will be offered in 8-week blocks throughout the fiscal year (including summer) to enhance pathways to degree completion and minimize work conflicts and other time constraints. Instructors will be encouraged to use Open Educational Resources whenever possible and appropriate to maximize student affordability.
