Implementation Plan: To track students transitioning from K-12 into postsecondary, data will be pulled from the K-12 SLDS and uploaded into the National Student Clearinghouse. With regard to postsecondary transitions, Idaho will also use the National Student Clearinghouse to meet this reporting requirement. OSBE will use the contract currently in place to track postsecondary transitions.

Responsible Agency: The SBOE is the responsible entity. SDE is managing the current K-12 data collection efforts and OSBE is managing the postsecondary data collection efforts. The OSBE has a contract with the National Student Clearinghouse for postsecondary data collection and the OSBE will work with SDE to use the National Student Clearinghouse for K-12 data transition requirements. Timeline: The K-12 SLDS began student-level data collection in the Fall of 2010; K-12 student-level graduate enrollment information will be available late Spring 2011. Discussions have begun with the National Student Clearinghouse regarding secondary data collection. A contract or agreement with the National Student Clearinghouse will be secured by the time the spring 2011 data is available. Idaho will publicly report this information by September 30, 2011.

Budget: The OSBE has a contract with the National Student Clearinghouse for postsecondary data collection and will work with SDE to use the National Student Clearinghouse for K-12 data transition requirements. Idaho will use the current contract to meet the postsecondary data linkage requirements, and will create a new one with SDE and the National Student Clearinghouse for the K-12 data transition requirements.
