Indicator (c)(11): Provide, for the State, for each LEA in the State, for each high school in the State and, at each of these levels, by student subgroup (consistent with section 1111(b)(2)(C)(v)(II) of the ESEA), of the students who graduate from high school consistent with 34 CFR 200.19(b)(1)(i), the number and percentage (including numerator and denominator) who enroll in an institution of higher education (IHE) (as defined in section 101(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended (HEA)) within 16 months of receiving a regular high school diploma.

Does the State collect these data (as defined in Indicator (c)(11))?

No, the State does not collect these data. The State will develop but not implement the means to collect and publicly report the data (i.e., the State will not collect and publicly report the data) by September 30, 2011.

Implementation Plan: For students transitioning from K-12 into postsecondary and those transitioning from one postsecondary institution to another, Idaho will use the National Student Clearinghouse to meet this reporting requirement.

Responsible Agency: The SBOE is the responsible entity. SDE is managing the current K-12 data collection efforts and OSBE is managing the postsecondary data collection efforts. Timeline: The K-12 SLDS began student-level data collection Fall 2010; therefore K-12 student-level graduate enrollment information will be available Spring 2011. It is anticipated that Idaho will begin collecting this information by June 2011, but not be able to report the data until it becomes available in the 16 months of a student receiving a regular high school diploma.

Budget: The OSBE has a contract with the National Student Clearinghouse for postsecondary data collection requirements. These expenses will be managed in existing internal budgets.
