10,013 concurrent credits were earned by high school students in 2011-2012



What does this mean for families?

At \$65.00 per credit, families paid \$650,845 for the 10,013 credits

COMPARISON:

- Boise State University credits cost \$201.16/ea
 - Current \$3,217 tuition/fees per semester (12-18 credits)
 - Divided by 16 (credits per semester needed to graduate in 4 years)
- 10,013 credits (after college enrollment) would cost \$2,014,215.08
- 10,013 concurrent credits cost \$650,845Net savings = \$1,363,370.08



Here's Pete's Story. .

(Pete is a 2010 graduate of a Jt. SD No. 2 high school)

What if Pete had made a different university choice?



- Boise State University
 - ✓ Cost of one year \$ 17,636 (One year savings to family

\$15,231)

- University of Oregon
 - ✓ Cost of one year \$38,436 (Non-Resident)
 (One year savings to family \$36,031)
 \$20,796 (Resident)

(One year savings to family

\$18,391)

- √ Stanford
 - ✓ Cost of one year \$55,385

 (One year savings to family)

\$52,980)



Pete started his college career with a 3.61 grade point average (GPA) for his 37 credits of freshman course work. This puts him on a firm footing to succeed academically in college!!!





Most importantly. . .

✓ Starting his college career with one full year of college completed significantly increases Pete's chances of completing his bachelors degree!!!

The rest of the story. . .

Pete is graduating this spring (2013) with his bachelor's degree (in three years). He will get his master's degree in year four; then sit for the CPA exam; and be well on his way to a successful and productive future.



A New Choice:

Renaissance High School cohort - 16 students will receive their Associates Degrees this spring, along with their high school diplomas.

Tech Prep

- Currently, Joint School District No. 2 has articulation agreements for professional technical courses with the following universities: CSI, CWI, ISU, Solano Community College (CA), Oregon Institute of Technology (PLTW)
- Tech Prep credit fees (cost per 1 credit) vary by institution.
 - CWI -\$10
 CSI-\$21
 ISU-\$15
 - LCSC-Free NIC-\$15 Solano-\$10 OTI \$25

Tech Prep Results

- 2009-2010 year approximately 2, 166 students were accepted into the Catema tracking system for Tech Prep from the Meridian School District (This includes Meridian Technical and Medical Arts Charter High Schools).
- Out of the 2, 166 students that signed up for the credit, 1400 students were eligible, by meeting the course requirements and industry exit testing, to purchase credit.
- Total Tech Prep Credits purchased by district students from Spring 2010 = 467 credits.

Conclusion

- Joint School District No. 2 is committed to continuing to expand the opportunity for students to earn post-secondary credits.
